Community art mosaic - creating a mosaic for public display, considering design, technique and materials.

Julie Norburn, Art4Space

Art4Space will host this workshop at their stunning Community Arts Centre in Stockwell, leading participants through each step in the process of setting up and running school and community mosaic projects. Participants will work collectively to make a community mosaic for public display, learning as they create together.

Cutting with hammer and hardie.

Giulia Vogrig, London School of Mosaic

LSoM will host this workshop at their well equipped teaching space in North London. Giulia will coach participants in the use of hammer and hardie, enabling everyone to experiment and improve their own skill with this particular cutting technique

Flippin' Unglued

John Sollinger, Artist and educator

Learn Solly's fluid double reverse technique that makes participants shudder in anticipation before the first flip, disoriented before the second flip, and (generally) happy with the end product. You will be practicing the technique by creating short-lived mosaics – you will not take a mosaic home. Solly will share some horror stories yet emphasize the advantages to laying all tesserae prior to applying adhesive. You will have time to practice and ask questions. All are welcome, regardless of skill levels, although experience with other methods may be disadvantageous.

Coralie Turpin and Jen Watson, Bamm North


This is a chance for Bamm members to make their own bird, reflecting on the Bamm North mosaic art installation, featured as part of Hull City of Culture celebrations in 2017. The full catalogue of the Hull birds will be available for inspiration. Aimed at mosaicists at all levels, the workshop will encourage participants to challenge their ideas by seeing how the artists and communities approached the templates. All materials will be provided and participants will complete (and possibly grout) their bird by the end of the workshop.

How to stand out from the crowd
